Give Wangaratta a chance to Grow

Wangaratta is a great town in a great place. We are ideally situated for business and industry because of our road, rail and airport facilities. Many of our roads are thoroughfares for tourist destinations like the snow, the mountains, other national parks and wineries.

But these advantages have been wasted by previous Councils, who have been too slow to seize business opportunities or have mishandled them, like the Security Foods Abattoir. \$30 million dollars worth of industry and jobs for Wangaratta, gone, because of mismanagement by Council.

As a general practitioner, I talk to people from all walks of life all day, and the same problems come up over and over again. The problems all come from having Councils in the past who have wasted your money on projects like the three walk bridges over the Ovens river. There is simply not enough money in Wangaratta for us to flourish, because:

- There are not enough JOBS
- There is not enough INDUSTRY
- Council concentrates on the WRONG things
- RATES are too high
- Planning permits are FAR TOO SLOW
- There is not enough HOUSING
- There is too much FLOODING of roads
- There is too little FREEWAY ACCESS
- There is not enough UNIVERSITY access

All of these things cause high rates of drug use and crime, which we could reduce with jobs and education opportunities for our residents. We are ideally placed to provide services to Northeast Victoria, and we need to take advantage of this.

I have worked as a volunteer in several countries, including the Congo, Kenya, South Africa and Swaziland. I was awarded the Humanitarian Overseas Service Medal for my work with the Rwandan refugees in 1994/95.

Military Service

I have served in the Army Reserve and the Regular Army, first as a soldier and later as a captain when I became a Medical Officer. I served in East Timor as part of the international stabilisation force in 2006/07. I was awarded the Australian Defence Medal, the Australian Service Medal and the East Timor Solidarity Medal. I was deployed to Kingslake with an army health team on Operation VIC FIRE ASSIST after the 2009 bush fires, and was awarded the Vic Fire Assist Medallion.

Previous Council Experience

Wangaratta Council was hideous before my election in 2012: In 2007, Councillor Justin Scholz was bullied until he resigned, and this tactic was also tried on me. An irregular permit was issued to the Security Foods Abattoir, who ended up abandoning their project. The Soldiers Memorial Town Hall was hastily demolished, against the wishes of residents. A former director admitted that previous employees went on "sick leave" to get the attention of the Minister, which is not what sick leave is for. We fixed this up, and since then I have been working easily with the new management team. I have confidence they will work well with the new Council in the interests of all residents equally.

Don't let Council go backwards!

Wangaratta needs good leadership to flourish. We have a great management team now, and we can use this election to get an effective Council as well.

Councillors need to listen to residents and respond sensibly to their concerns. I will make Council available to residents regularly and formally to hear their concerns.

Councillors need to debate in public. I won't have discussions in secret, and vote silently in public.

Residents need more warning about meetings. I will ensure that meeting agendas are published the week prior to meetings so residents can consider them.

I will ensure Council treats everyone fairly and equally. I will stop the special treatment of a few.
